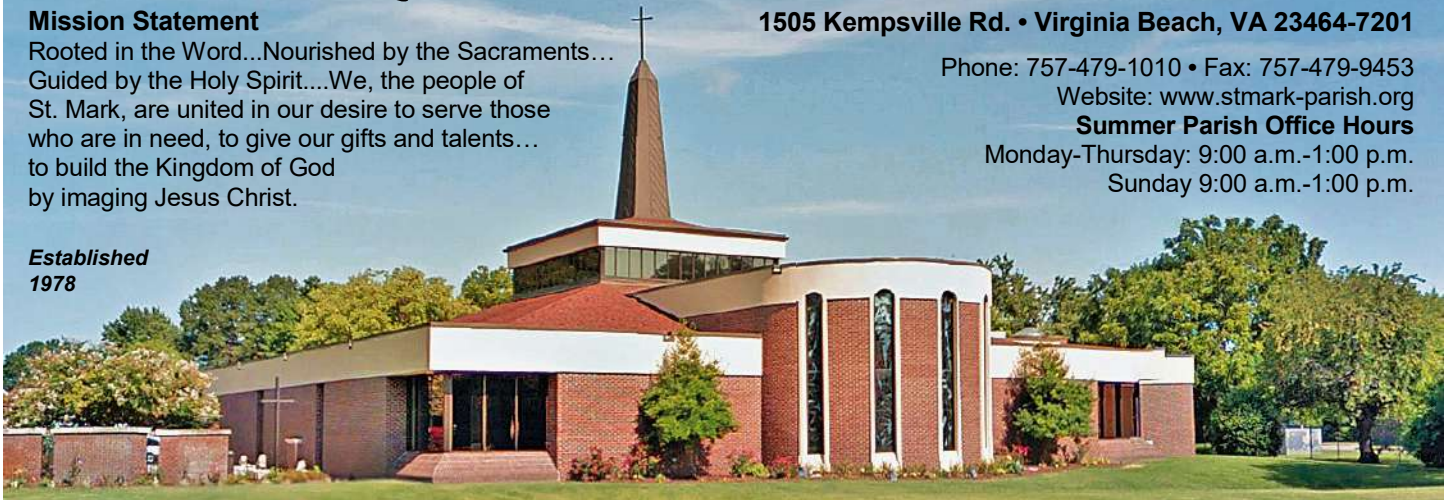

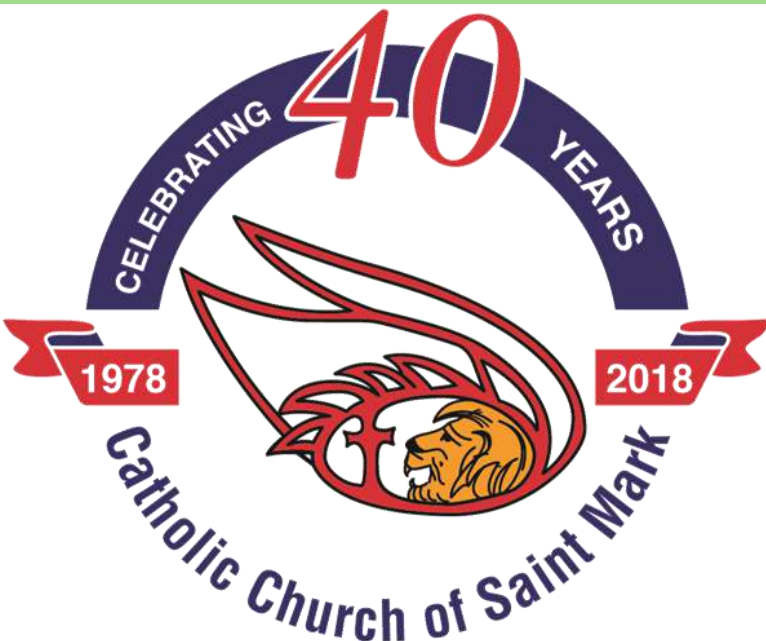
BAPTISM: Celebrated the 1st weekend of the month except during Lent. Contact Religious Formation Office for Baptism classes prior to the Sacrament.

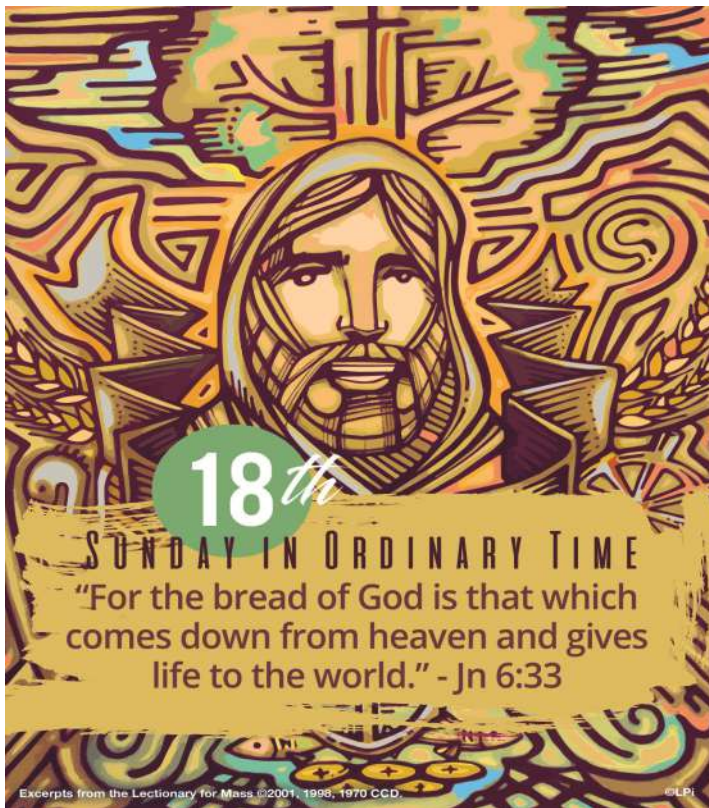
MATRIMONY: Couples required to give 6 months notice before planning a wedding in the Parish. Please do not set date before contacting the Priest.

ADVANCE NOTICE ON TRAFFIC RECONSTRUCTION. If you pass through the intersection of Indian River Road and Kempsville Road you may have seen signs leading to the beginning of a major construction renovation of the crossing. For the next 18 months or so you may want to avoid the intersection all together. The City has begun constructing what is called a "Continuous Flow Intersection" or "CFI" at the crossing. This will be the only intersection of its kind in South East VA. For your own sanity it would be wise to find an alternate route around the intersection during the construction process.
