BAPTISM: Celebrated the 1st weekend of the month except during Lent. Contact Religious Formation Office for Baptism classes prior to the Sacrament.

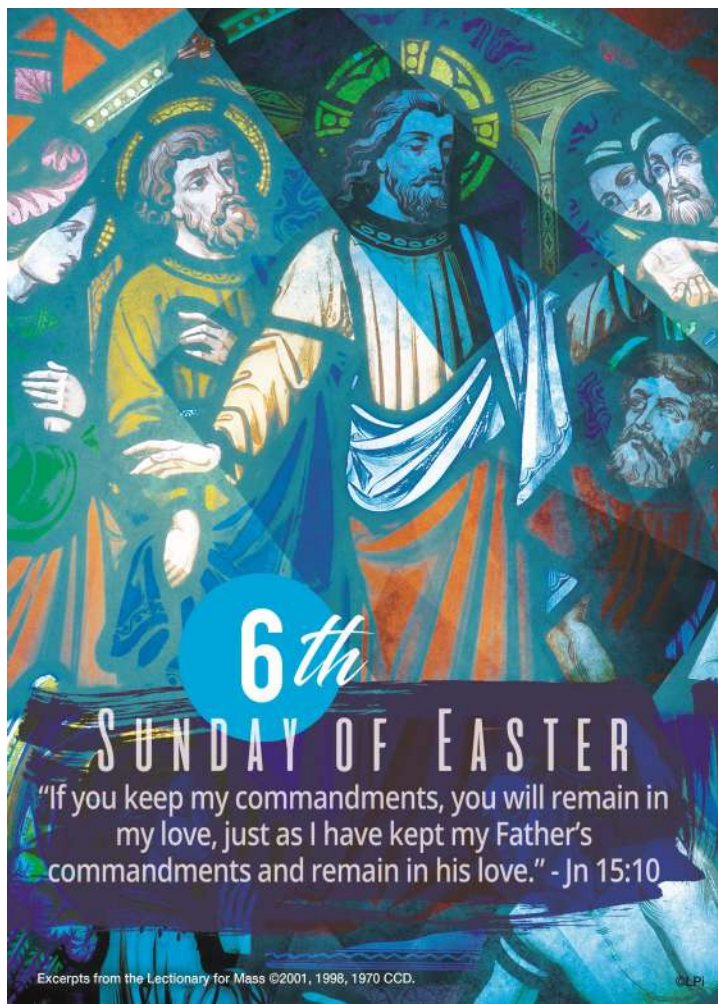
MATRIMONY: Couples required to give 6 months notice before planning a wedding in the Parish. Please do not set date before contacting the Priest.

"When an alien resides with you in your land, you shall not oppress the alien. ³⁴ The alien who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; you shall love the alien as yourself, for you were aliens in the land of Egypt" - Leviticus 19: 33-34

The Catholic approach to migration is rooted in the Gospel and the tradition of Catholic Social teaching. A migrant is a person who leave their land and travels to another country for a variety of reasons. Some of the causes that drive people to migrate include; persecution and war, lack of jobs or resources capable of sustaining one's family, famine or natural disasters, family separation or limited opportunities. These are just a few of many reasons which cause people to migrate. As a response, the Catholic Church has decided to advocate for justice for immigrants, and continues to remind us how we ought to treat those who out of desperation or while seeking the betterment of their families find themselves in our nation.
