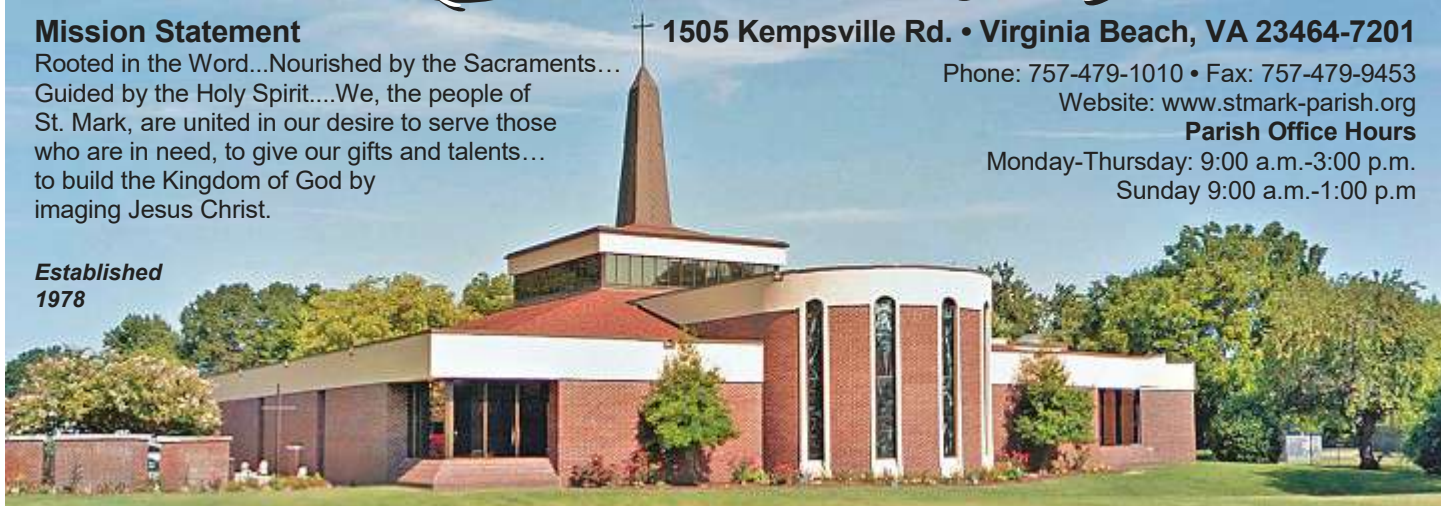

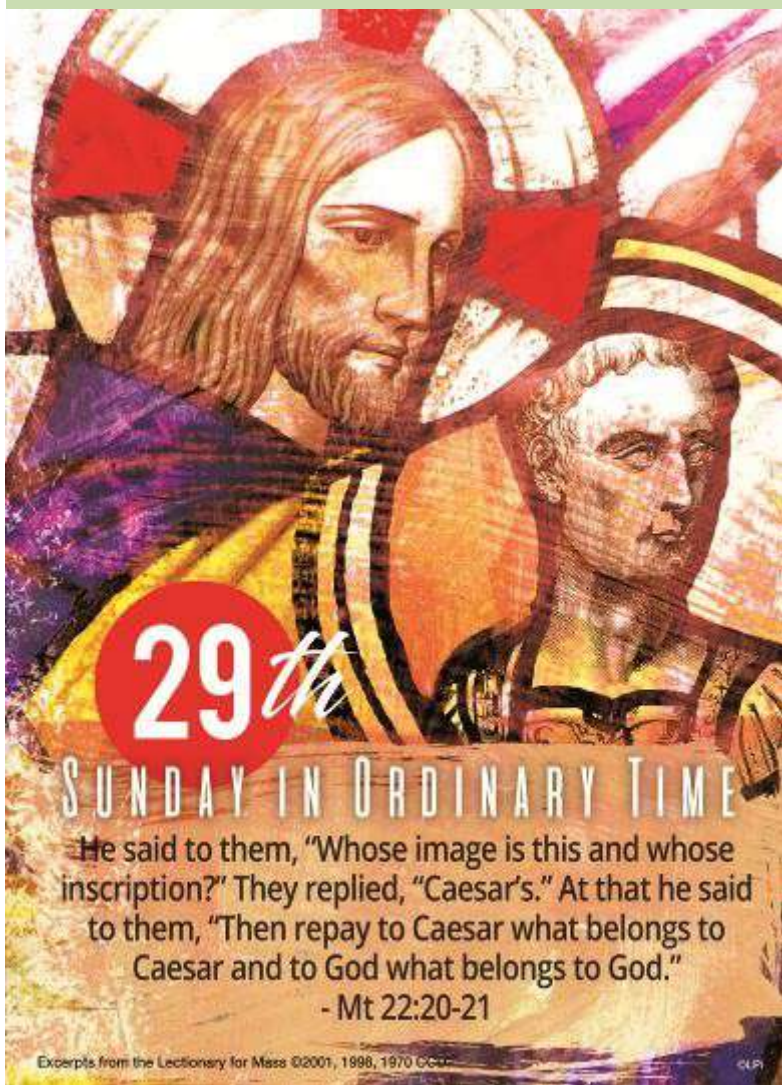
BAPTISM: Celebrated the 1st weekend of the month except during Lent. Contact Religious Formation Office for Baptism classes prior to the Sacrament.

## Fr. Anthony's Reflection

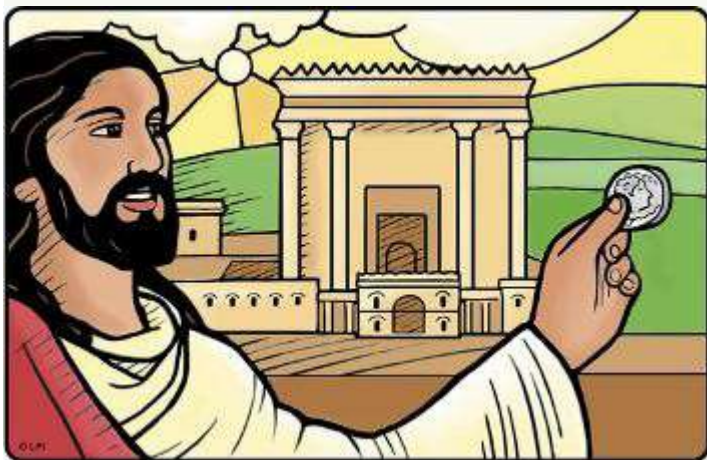
I welcome you to this Sunday and we are thankful for the gift of our faith. In today's Gospel reading, the Pharisees were trapping Jesus by asking him, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" This was a wrong approach that they used and good enough Jesus was able to discover their intentions.

The Pharisees were opposed to Roman domination and on the other hand the partisans of Herod accepted it. If Jesus said that they are to pay it, the Pharisees would discredit him before the people and this what they wanted. If he said no, the partisans of Herod would have him arrested by the Romans. Jesus did not condemn Roman imperialism, nor did justify it.

Governments have the responsibility to take care of their citizens by providing the basic amenities of life such as infrastructure, health services, education and things in that line. At the same time, it is a duty of every citizen to pay taxes to the state, and Christians should be the best example in doing this. Both Governments and citizens, however, should not forget that everything comes from God.

# Liturgy Corner

With the month of November "looming on the horizon" we will be celebrating this special month of remembrance a little differently to follow Diocesan / Commonwealth guidelines.



During November we are called in a special way to remember "our brothers and sisters who fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection." A Book of Remembrance is placed in a place of honor with the transcribed names of their dearly beloved who will be remembered in prayer in a special way during this month.

This year, the Book of Remembrance will be placed in the Worship Space (Nave) beginning on All Soul's Day through the month of November. Rather than having multiple people writing, handling or waiting in line to inscribe names in it and to keep our tradition honored, we will have cards available on the table as you enter the Commons to pick up and fill out in your pew. Once completed (up to 10 names of dearly departed), please drop your card in the basket at the exit. Those names on the cards will then be transcribed in the Book of Remembrance and returned to its place of honor. We will have this process in effect through the month of November.

In addition, to honor our dearly departed, we will have tables set-up in the Commons for their framed pictures. Please bring those framed pictures before the end of the month of October for a set-up display by our Art and Environment committee. Please place your names and phone numbers on the back of the frame; they will be available for pick up at the end of the month of November.

# Welcome!

As we gather again for the celebration of Mass, we are all asked to do our part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Out of an abundance of caution for others gathered, please be aware, prior to entering the church, an usher will ask you a series of questions. Please be patient and wait for their instructions regarding seating, as we must comply with social distancing guidelines. We ask that everyone takes the following precautions:

Stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation. **Our virtual Mass is at 10am!**

Maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in the church or on church property.

All those aged 10 and up and those to receive Communion must wear a face mask or face covering. Be sure the mask covers your nose and mouth.

Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.

Sanitize hand when entering and leaving church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion, if possible.

Consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand.

**If you have a fever or symptoms of COVID-19 or not wearing a facemask, you will not be permitted to enter the building.**

# A Saint Story

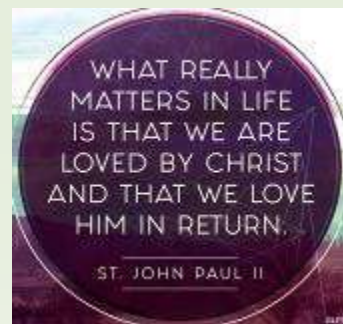
## Saint Paul of the Cross

Born in northern Italy in 1694, Paul Daneo lived at a time when many regarded Jesus as a great moral teacher but no more. After a brief time as a soldier, he turned to solitary prayer, developing a devotion to Christ's passion. Paul saw in the Lord's passion a demonstration of God's love for all people. In turn that devotion nurtured his compassion and supported a preaching ministry that touched the hearts of many listeners. He was known as one of the most popular preachers of his day, both for his words and for his generous acts of mercy.

In 1720, Paul founded the Congregation of the Passion, whose members combined devotion to Christ's passion with preaching to the poor, and rigorous penances. Known as the Passionists, they add a fourth vow to the traditional three of poverty, chastity, and obedience, to spread the memory of Christ's passion among the faithful. Paul was elected superior general of the Congregation in 1747, spending the remainder of his life in Rome. Paul of the Cross died in 1775, and was canonized in 1867. Over 2,000 of his letters and several of his short writings have survived.

## The Feast of St. John Paul II

On October 21st, we celebrate the pope who inspired the world! Born Karol Wojtyla in Krakow, Pope John Paul II became the first-ever Polish pope. He came of age in the early 20th century and lived through both the Nazi and communist occupations of Poland. His resistance activities were cultural, operating an underground theater company and entering a secret seminary. Karol was ordained a priest in 1946 and later a bishop. He was elected pope in 1978. As pope, the interests that captured his heart as a young man continued -- his pastoral concern for young people, his philosophical emphasis on the human person, and his devotion to Mary and to the mercy of God. St. John Paul II, pray for us!

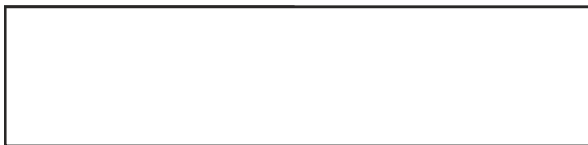
